With the aim to become one of the top technical universities in the country IGDTUW provides quality technical and management education with industry relevant curriculum and focus on experiential learning through internships, project work and industrial visits.

IGDTUW is known for its unique blend of teaching methodologies and industry- ready students. IGDTUW gives utmost importance towards conducting quality and industry relevant research in the areas of science, technology and engineering. Many labs exist in various departments of the university and university faculty have developed critical resources through sponsored research projects. IGDTUW has partnered with several leading universities to promote various forms of academic collaborations with institutions as well as industry. These collaborations are likely to lead to a significant improvement in the learning experience of the students, value addition of the faculty, bridging gaps between academia & industry and ensuring better placements and excellent higher education opportunities for its students. Some of the notable collaborations include the one with National Ping Tung University [NPTU], Taiwan for research collaboration, student and faculty exchange with a particular focus on management disciplines; NASSCOM & CISCO for setting-up of “thingQbator” Innovation lab; M/s. The University offers MBA, BBA, 6 Year Dual Degree [B. Tech (MAE) + MBA], B.Tech. in [CSE, IT, ECE, MAE and CSE-Artificial Intelligence], B. Arch., M.Tech. in [CSE (AI), IT (ISM), ECE (VLSI), MAE (Robotics & Automation), M. Plan (Urban Planning), MCA and Ph.D. courses.

Societies, Memberships and Social Initiatives

The University has established chapters with memberships available for seven Technical societies like ACM, IEEE, OSA etc., many Societies such as Zosh, Huumanoid, Samanvay, Mudra (ॐ), Vartta, The fine you - Mental and Physical Health Society, The Public Relations Cell and clubs related to various Technical, Art, Culture and Environment related activities. The Annual cultural festival "TARANGANA" of IGDTUW is a big attraction amongst the students in the NCR region. This cultural festival over two days hosts a wide array of enthusiastic students who indulge in myriad activities to display and dabble with their creativity.

IGDTUW believes in holistic development of students and shows acute concern in inculcating social responsibilities. In line with Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, IGDTUW has adopted five villages to spread digital literacy, health and sanitation awareness, etc. Since last year University is working for Vigyan Jyoti Project of DST with the mandate to promote and create awareness on STEM Education among the girl students. This Project has fetched an over-whelming response from Government Schools where students of Class 10th came for training during summer breaks and walked out confidently with a self-made working robot.

University has signed several MoU with leading industries including NASSCOM Foundation, IBM, Cyber peace Foundation, Fluor Daniel and several others for technical upgradation of students. It has also received research grant and project grant from various Government agencies.

In another social initiative, to encourage girl students to take up science courses and help them choose career-oriented programmes in higher studies, IGDTUW in collaboration with Delhi government launched an '**Education Mentoring Programme**' on 20th March 2021. Under this programme, over 200 students from Indira Gandhi Delhi Technological University for Women will mentor more than 1,000 girl students of Delhi government schools studying in grades 9 to 12, clearing their doubts related to careers in STEM, share strategies for clearing entrance exams, support in accessing learning resources and motivate them as they transition from school to colleges and careers. Designed and dedicated to the Delhi School going girls, the program will help unleash their immense potential in the field of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics).



Training and Placements Cell

Department Of Management

The department of management, a new feather to IGDTUW cap, has a vision to be recognised as a centre of excellence in management education globally by imparting a cross-functional perspective to develop future women leaders and women entrepreneurs who can manage effective business organisations. We also offer responsible management education with a global outlook grounded in Indian ethical values and beliefs. To meet the challenges of a dynamic business environment we equip young women with a right blend of theoretical and practical business management knowledge, which enables them to develop sharp analytical skills and distinct entrepreneurial capabilities to facilitate them in emerging as future business leaders. The Department is currently running a BBA course since 2019 and a two-year full-time MBA course from the Academic Session 2020-21 in order to cater to the growing industry need for Management graduates along with technical background.

The courses aim at providing specialization in business and management principles for aspirants that have the motivation & desire to gain a broad understanding of societal context and become a leader in the world without boundaries. The Curriculum establishes a common foundation in the fundamental practices of business including finance, marketing, leadership, negotiation, operations, strategy, and more. In addition to acquiring specific analytical and quantitative skills, students become acclimated to Management Program standards of communication and collaboration, and develop strong, lasting relationships with one. The syllabus is meticulously designed as per the latest CBCS curriculum to gain insight into the perspective of management and to understand the larger context.

The BBA and MBA courses are divided into four distinct areas, namely:

- Departmental Core Courses (DCC)
- Allied Management Course (AMC)
- Departmental Elective Courses (DEC)
- Generic Open Elective Courses (GEC)

The curriculum promotes industrial visits to esteemed Organizations. Summer Project and Major Project with due weightage of credits are an integral part of the curriculum. We provide the option to earn Research Based Credits and offer the flexibility to incorporate online MOOC Courses. The pedagogy actively involves Case-Method learning with smaller hands-on team projects, personal reflection and research or entrepreneurial projects.

Eligibility and Admission Procedure

Eligibility Criteria

A woman candidate who has scored at least 50% marks in 12th board examination from a recognised board and must also have passed English (Core/Elective/Functional) as a subject in the 12th Board Examination. Those who are appearing in the examination may also apply, provided that they submit the proof of eligibility by a specific date declared by the University.

Admission Criteria

The merit list shall be drawn on the basis of marks in **best of four subjects (including English)** in XII Board examination or its equivalent examination. Vocational courses (as specified in the CBSE list) will not be counted in the best four subjects.

To resolve and determine inter se merit of candidates having same percentage in the best of four subjects (including English), following criterion will be used in the stated order of preference:

1. Candidates having higher score in English (core/elective/functional) will be given preference.
2. In case the score in English is same, then date of birth will be considered. Elder candidate will be given preference.

NOTE : Candidates who have appeared at the Annual Examination in the year 2021 and have been placed in compartment will not be eligible for admission for the year 2021.

Age Criteria

For BBA Program in IGDTUW, maximum age should not be more than 40 years on 30.09.2021.

Relaxation in Minimum Marks Criterion in Qualifying Examination for Reserved Category/Sub-Category Candidates

Candidates belonging to various reserved categories namely OBC (Non -Creamy Layer), Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, and sub -categories namely Defence, Person with Disability, who apply for seats reserved for them, shall be allowed a relaxation in the minimum marks criterion as mentioned below:

- (i) **Other Backward Class (OBC -NCL):** Candidates claiming reservation under Other Backward Class (Non-Creamy Layer) category shall be allowed a relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum marks criterion in the qualifying examination.
- (ii) **Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST):** Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) shall be allowed a relaxation of 10% marks in the minimum marks criterion in the qualifying examination.
- (iii) **Defence (CW):** Candidates claiming reservation under Defence sub-category (CW) shall be allowed a relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum marks criterion in the qualifying examination.

(iv) **Persons with Disabilities (PwD):** Candidates claiming reservation under "Persons with Disabilities" (PwD) sub-category shall be allowed a relaxation of 10% marks.

Intake

The annual intake of this program is 75. The reservation of the seats for SC/ST/OBC/EWS and sub categories Defence/PwD are as per the norms. One seat is for Kashmiri Migrant over and above the total intake. However, there will be no relaxation in the minimum eligibility criteria for Kashmiri Migrant.

Reservation Policy

Delhi Region

Delhi Region Candidates (85% of seats) - A candidate passing the qualifying examination from a recognized School / College / Institute located within the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi will be considered for Delhi Region only.

Outside Delhi

Outside Delhi Region Candidates (15% of seats) - A candidate passing the qualifying examination from a recognized School / College / Institute located outside the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi will be considered for Outside Delhi Region only.

NOTE: For a candidate, who has passed the qualifying examination through Patrachar Vidyalaya, Delhi / National Institute of Open School, Delhi (NIOS), the criterion for deciding the region shall be the location of her centre of examination. In other words, if the centre of examination is located in the N.C.T. of Delhi, the candidate shall be considered under the Delhi Region and if the centre of examination is located outside N.C.T. of Delhi, she shall be considered under the Outside Delhi Region.

a) Scheduled Caste (SC): 15 % of the total seats are reserved for Scheduled Caste candidates.

b) Scheduled Tribe (ST): 7.5 % of the total seats are reserved for Scheduled Tribe candidates.

c) Other Backward Class (OBC- NCL): 27% of the total seats are reserved for Other Backward Class (Non-Creamy Layer) candidates.

D) Economically Weaker Section (EWS): 10% of the total seats are reserved for EWS category as per the office order DHE.1 (119)/Estt. /2018- 19/2549-76 dated 17/06/2019

Sub-categories namely 'Defence' and 'Person with Disability' are available under each category (General, SC, ST, OBC-NCL).

e) Defence (CW): 5% of the total seats (Horizontal) in each main category are reserved for candidates belonging to Defence sub-category in the following order of priority:

Priority I - Widows/wards of Defence Personnel killed in action.

Priority II – Wards of disabled in action and boarded out from service.

Priority III - Widows/wards of Defence Personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service.

Priority IV - Wards of disabled in service and boarded out from service with disability attributable to military service.

Priority V - Wards of Ex-Servicemen and serving personnel/para military/police personnel who are in receipt of the following Gallantry Awards: 1. Param Vir Chakra 2. Ashok Chakra 3. Mahavir Chakra 4. Kirti Chakra 5. Vir Chakra 6. Shaurya Chakra 7. Sena/Nau Sena/ Vayu Sena Medal 8. Mention-in-Despatches 9. President's Police Medal for Gallantry 10. Police Medal for Gallantry

Priority VI – Wards of Ex-servicemen.

Priority VII – Wives of:

1. Defence personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service
2. Defence personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service
3. Ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry awards.

Priority VIII – Wards of serving personnel.

Priority IX - Wives of serving personnel.

f) Person with Disability: 5% of the total seats (Horizontally) in each category are reserved for candidates belonging to 'Person with Disability' sub-category in accordance with the provisions of 'The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016' (PwD Act).

g) Kashmiri Migrants (Supernumerary): 01 (One) seat, over and above the total intake is available under this category. First preference will be given to Kashmiri Migrant candidate:

- (i) who has passed the qualifying examination from a school/college/ institute located within the NCT of Delhi;
- (ii) whose parents are registered in Delhi up to 11.06.2001 as Kashmiri Migrant; and
- (iii) who is residing in the N.C.T. of Delhi.

Note:

i. In case of category (a) and (b), the vacant seats are interchangeable.

ii. In case, sufficient numbers of eligible candidates from category (c) are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved.

iii. Seats under sub-category (f) are interchangeable within the sub category if sufficient number of candidates is not available in a particular group.

iv. In case, sufficient number of eligible candidates from the sub categories mentioned at (e) and (f) are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved in the respective category.

v. Under CW sub-category, the seats will be filled based on the priority, i.e., all eligible candidates of priority-I will be allotted seats based on their ranks until the ranks exhaust or seats exhaust under CW sub category. Remaining vacant seats, if any, will be allotted to the priority-II in the similar way, and so on.

vi. The reservation under CW sub category is available only to such candidates who fall under the listed priorities.

vii. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his/her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories/sub categories. The candidates claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/KM categories, CW/PwD sub-categories will be required to upload scanned copy of the respective certificates and produce the original certificate of the respective reserved category/sub-category issued by the competent authority (as mentioned in this information brochure) in the respective institutes at the time of physical verification of the documents. If the reserved category/ sub-category certificate is not found in order, no benefit of the reserved category/ sub-category will be given and the candidate shall be considered for allotment in GENERAL category in subsequent rounds on submission of written request by the candidate to CMAC in person or email in this regard, as per the eligibility of the candidate and availability of seats. **If such a candidate is able to produce her category certificate before the commencement of further round, she shall be considered for the category in that round and will be allotted a fresh seat as per the vacancy available and her merit.**

viii) After exhausting the complete list of registered SC, ST, OBC and EWS candidates, an equivalent number of unreserved seats shall be created against the vacant reserved category seats in the "SPOT ROUND".

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. Interested female candidates are required to fill the online application form available on www.cmac.admissions.nic.in
2. The candidates are required to fill the online application form and make an online payment of Rs. 1,000/- (one thousand only) for General/OBC Category and Rs. 500 for SC/ST and PwD.
3. Incomplete application, due to any reason, is liable for rejection by the University.

Withdrawal/RefundPolicy

The withdrawal policy of admission for the academic calendar year 2021-22 only amid COVID-19 Pandemic is as follows:

1. **The last date for withdrawal cancellation of admission with full refund will be up to 31/10/2021.**
2. **In the event of a student who has withdrawn admission after 31/10/2021 till 31/12/2021, the entire fee collected from the student shall be refunded after deducting Rs.1000/- towards processing fee.**

For admission to a seat reserved for Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class (NCL), candidate must produce a certificate, in original, issued from an approved district authority stating the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class (NCL), to which the candidate belongs. A list of approved authorities is given below:

- a. District Magistrate/Additional Magistrate/Deputy Commissioner/ Collector/Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- c. Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidates and/or his/her family normally resides.
- D. Administrator/Secretary to Administration/Development Officer (Laccadive &Minicoy Islands).

NOTE:

1. The candidate seeking admission under reserved categories has to mandatorily upload the caste/ category certificate in his/her name at the time of filling up of the ONLINE form. The certificate in the name of either of the parents (mother/father) or any other family member is not acceptable and the candidate will not be entitled even for provisional admission.

The reservation certificate should be issued from the respective state/region in which the reservation is being claimed, e.g., in case, a candidate claims the seat reserved for the Delhi Region category, she has to bring SC/ ST/OBC certificate issued by Govt. of NCT of Delhi and should have also passed her

2. OBC (NCL) candidates are required to produce a caste certificate issued after March 31, 2021 from the authorities as mentioned above. However, if the certificate is issued prior to March 31, 2021, it must be accompanied with an additional certificate regarding the present non-creamy layer status of the candidate, issued by the same competent authority. This additional certificate must have reference of his/her already issued original caste certificate.
3. Students claiming OBC reservation under Delhi region will be admitted in this category on the submission of a certificate to this effect from the Competent Authority of the Government of NCT of Delhi. Certificate issued by Govt. of India or any state government will not be accepted under any circumstances. A certificate issued by a Competent Authority of Delhi to an individual on the basis of Caste Certificate of her parents from another state will be accepted for claiming a seat under OBC Category **IF AND ONLY IF** the caste is in the list of notified OBC list by Govt. of NCT of Delhi.

ii. Defence sub - category (CW): For admission to a seat reserved for Defence sub-category, candidate must produce the following certificates (as applicable), in original, at the time of document verification of Defence candidates:

- A. Entitlement card in original issued by the Record Officer of the Unit/ Regiment of Armed Personnel of the Armed Forces in case of Armed Personnel.
- b. Widows/ Wards/ Wives of the officers and men of Armed forces who died or were disabled on duty (both attributable to military service) must produce a certificate to that effect from the following authorities:
 - i. Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board.
 - ii) Secretary, Rajya / Zila Sainik Board.
 - Iii) Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
- c. Medical records in original.
- d. Special Pension Order and Passbook indicating special pension.
- e. Gallantry Award Certificate.
- f. Original ex-servicemen Identity Card/Discharge Book/ Pension Payment Order.
- g. Dependency card issued by the competent authority in order to relate the relationship of the candidate with the Defence personnel.
- h. Original Service Identity Card.

- i. A certificate from the respective C.O. Unit in respect of serving personnel.

NOTE: A statement to the effect that 'the death/disability is attributed to military service' is required to be included in the certificate for Priority III & IV.

iii. Person with Disability sub-category:

For admission to seat reserved for person with disabilities (PwD) sub- category, the candidate must upload the following certificates at the time of filling up the Online form:

- a. Certificate of physical disability issued by the Competent Authority as per the provisions of the Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 in the prescribed format as given under the Act.

iv. Kashmiri Migrants: The candidates seeking admission under Kashmiri Migrants seats must upload the following documents at the time of filling up of the online application:

- A. Certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by the Relief Commissioner, Jammu or Divisional Commissioner, Delhi to establish the status of the applicant as registered migrants. Such a certificate should be issued by the concerned Deputy Commissioner of Delhi or the Competent Authority outside Delhi.

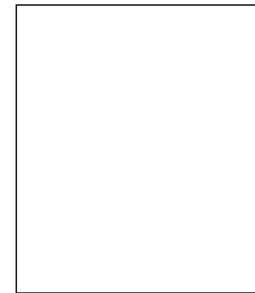

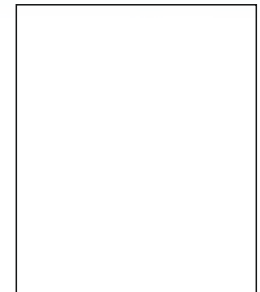

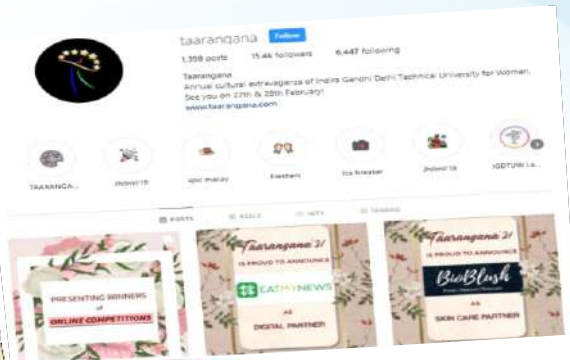

A student of Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women (IGDTUW) has landed a job offer of ₹26.45 lakh by Google-India. Jap Leen Kaur Jolly bagged the highest annual CTC package.

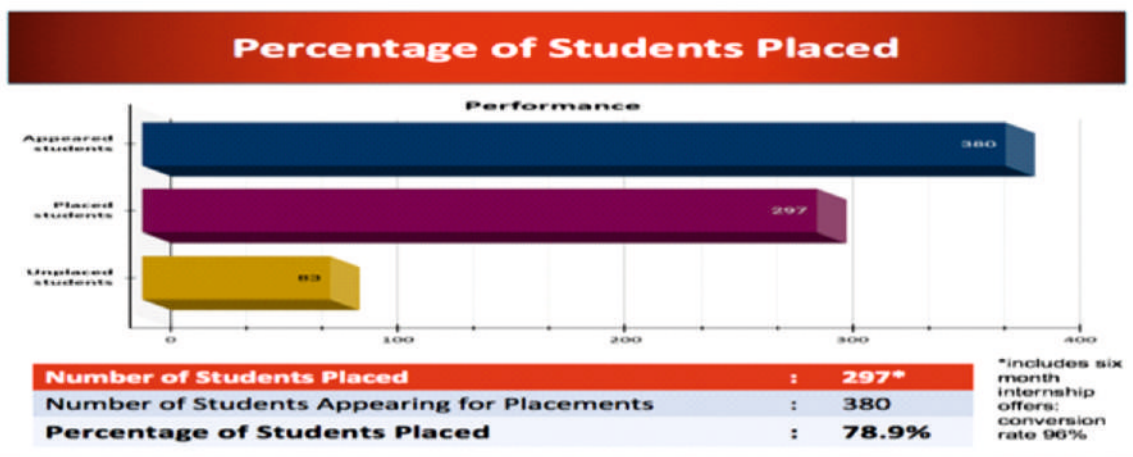
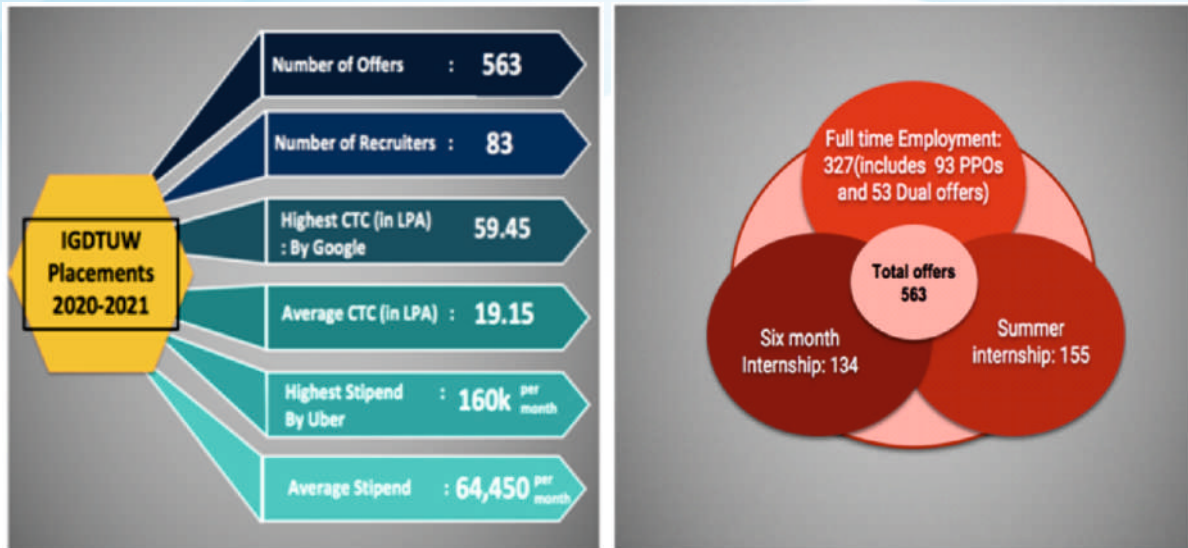

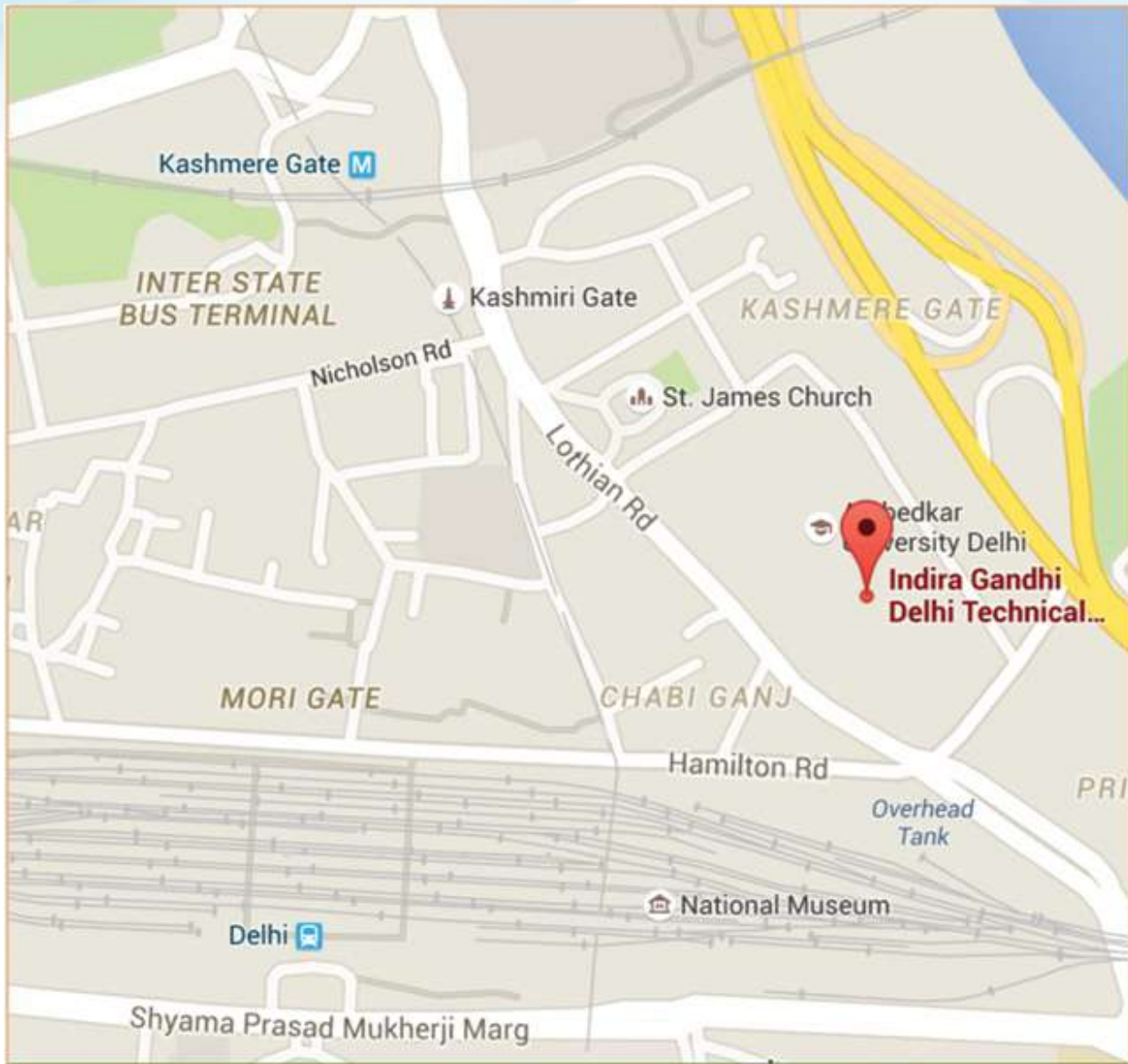
